RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. All vehicle/float entries must have a fire extinguisher on board;
2. Ensure vehicle gasoline is full;
3. Each entry must provide own water/umbrellas/snacks for participants;
4. Secure anchored handrails for persons standing on float/vehicle;
5. Parade lineup begins at 4 AM southeast of Greyhills Academy High School, on the corner of Warrior Drive and East Street. Upon check-in with registration, you will be issued your parade float entry number.
6. This is an alcohol & drug free event;
7. Mini bikes, go-carts etc. must be operated by an individual age 13 years or older;
8. All pets must be on a leash;
9. For safety purposes, you are prohibited from throwing bottles, cans, fruit, promotional items, and/or any other hard items into the crowd;
10. Throwing items from inside or on a vehicle, trailer, mini-bike, go-cart, or any motorized vehicle is strictly prohibited. For the safety of spectators and participants, all items must be distributed from alongside the road.
11. You shall provide your own float banner(s). Entry numbers must be placed on the driver side of the vehicle or on the left side of the float.
12. **EQUESTRIAN ENTRIES ONLY: Be Reminded You MUST have 3 or more ‘pooper scoopers’ following your group to ensure your riders’ horse droppings are picked up along the parade route** (Tools required: wheelbarrow, shovels, and gloves).

ORDER OF PARADE LINE UP:

1. Police Departments (Navajo/State/County)
2. Welcome Banner
3. Grand Marshall (1)
4. Veteran Group
5. Navajo Nation President & Vice-President (Limited to 2 vehicles, no buses)
6. Miss Navajo Nation 2017/2018
7. To’Nanees’Dizi Chapter Officials (*Optional*)
8. Navajo Nation Band
9. Open to parade line up - FIRST COME FIRST SERVE basis.

ROUTE MAP:

1. Registration will be located on the corner of Warrior Drive and East Street. Onsite registration will be located directly in front of the old BIA Fire station, registration canopy will be visible.
2. Parade will begin at 9am DST promptly. Despite rain, wind, or shine.
3. Line up begins on *Warrior Drive* just west of the Warrior Pavilion by the old baseball field. Route turns west on *Edgewater Drive*, continues until Main Street then turns south continuing down Main Street until the route turns west on *Maloney street* (corner on KFC Plaza). Disband passing through the NHA Housing units. For safety purposes do not park in this area to disband. Continue through the area to disband ahead.
